Stormwater Pond Pedestrian Bridge Removal

The City of Edmonton will soon begin demolition and removal of three connected pedestrian bridges (B344, B345 and B346) spanning the EPCOR stormwater management pond behind the residences on Hillard Green NW and Hayward Crescent NW.

Project Background

Following a routine inspection in 2024, these bridges were permanently closed due to irreversible structural damage. While originally constructed by neighbourhood developers and managed by the local Homeowners Association (HOA), responsibility for the structures was later transferred to the City of Edmonton at the community's request.

Due to safety concerns, budget constraints and the structures having reached the end of their service life, the bridges will be removed rather than replaced. Alternate access around the storm pond already exists for users and will remain.

Construction Details

- Removals are anticipated to take place between late February and April 2026. Please note that this timeline is weather-dependent.
- The main trail around the storm pond will remain open.
- Once the bridges are removed, the City will realign the trail to create a more seamless connection to the existing storm pond loop. The affected areas will be revegetated and returned to a natural state.

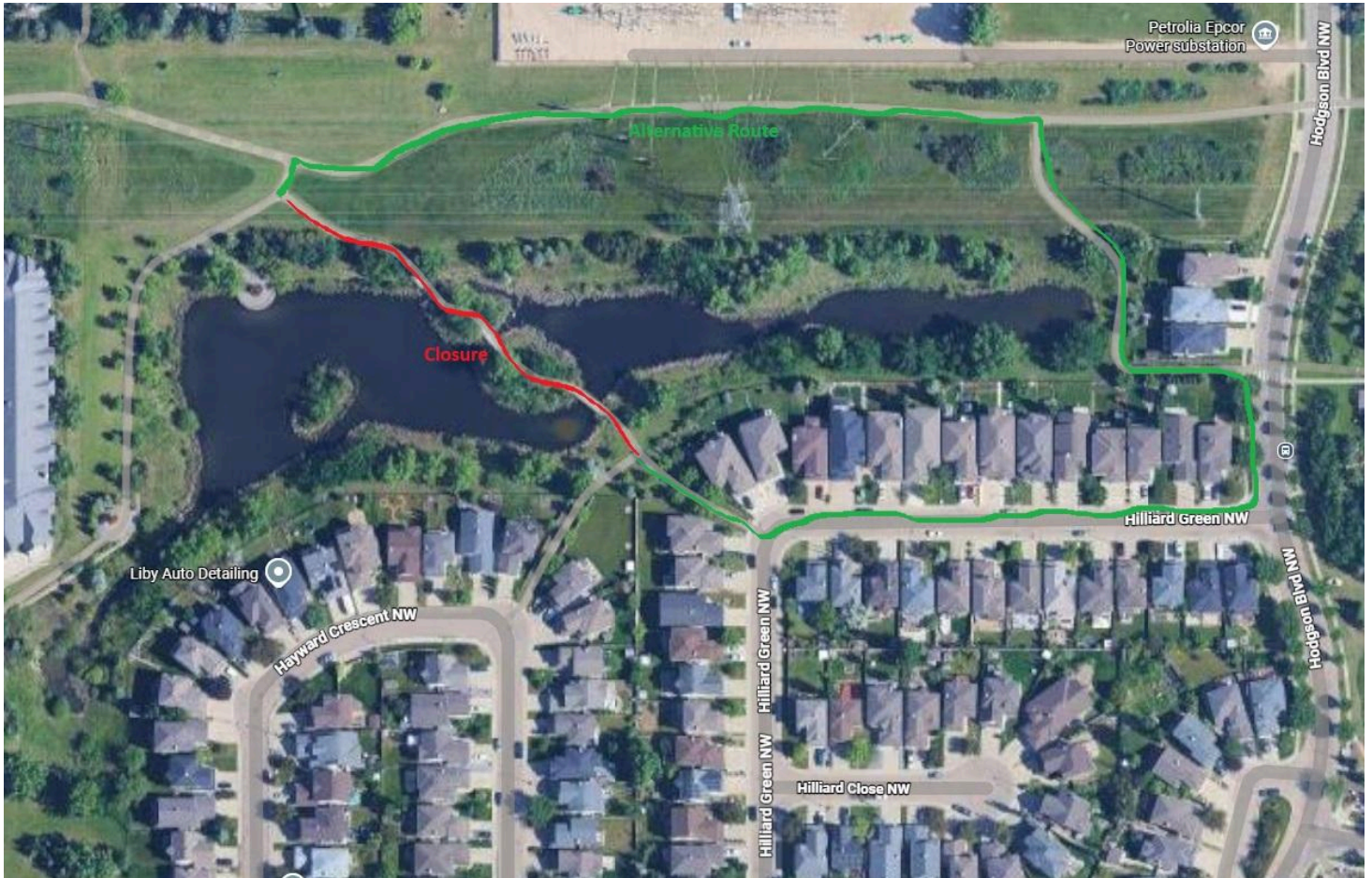


Image 1 (above) — Alternative route for pedestrians
